For several months Francisca Trexler has been giving Bible studies with Deaf people from Bronx through a video phone call. It was a very frustrating experience because it wasn't easy for some Deaf persons to find a Bible verse. An Adventist Deaf member who grew up in Adventist home wasn't familiar with the Bible. She has a little knowledge of the Bible. Francisca tried very hard showing her where to find it. I watched the struggle and began to think of sending her to Bronx to make the Bible study successful through her presence. I discussed with her the idea of staying in Bronx. She agreed so we spent

However, Francisca wasn't familiar with the city of Bronx so we decided to try to get help from a Deaf friend who lives there. But, God did a wonderful way of providing a place for Francisca to stay and to study.

There was a special meeting given by Jessica McGowan Smith who brought 12 Deaf people in a rented van to attend a Spanish Adventist church where Pastor Manuel Rosario, Personal Ministries Director for the Greater New York Conference would be. We thought it was a good opportunity for us to go there to help with the establishment of the Deaf ministry in this conference. So, we drove up to the Soundview SDA Church. Charmaine Logan, Pura Valdez and Hector Camacho showed up at the church to be part of the special meeting. The meeting was productive and Charmaine would be able to help Francisca to find a place to stay.

A few weeks later Francisca went to Bronx by train and she stayed at Charmaine's friend's apt. Tuesday to Friday Francisca worked with Pura and Hector at the Spanish church for two weeks. Later Pura and Hector invited their two other

friends to join the fellowship. The Bible study was effective because Francisca helped them to know where to find texts in the Bible. It was a very enriching experience for them.

After two weeks Francisca ioined with them in a bus to the camp meeting at Cherokee Camp near Lake Saranac. But Francisca left the bus at Albany where David picked her up on the way to the camp meeting. As per Jessica McGowan Smith's suggestion Francisca met with those people in a different room to share the speakers' presentation to simplify the message for their sake since they were not familiar with the Bible. It was a true blessing for them.

Francisca will return to Bronx to continue with the mission work with hopes that more Deaf people will join the Bible study group. I believe that it is the first time for 3ADM to send out its Bible worker to the area that has no skilled leader to lead the Deaf to know Jesus Christ. New York City is a huge territory that needs the light of hope. 3ADM is anxious to have more workers in different dark areas of the North America. Is it possible? With God and your support, yes. Please pray for them and let the Holy Spirit guide and touch them to accept Jesus Christ.

Speaker's Dialogue: Fight! Don't Give Up!

The farewell words of Apostle Paul has impressed my mind for years as I continue my spiritual journey in fighting against the power of evils. "For I am already being poured out as a drink offering, and the time of my departure has come. I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, and I have kept the faith. From now on a crown of righteousness is laid up for me, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will give me on that Day, and not only to me but also to all who have loved His appearing" (2 Timothy 4:6). I have not fought with my hands, words, sword, rifle, etc. I am fighting still with the Word of God as my weapon against the power of darkness. It has never been an easy battle since I have failed sometimes due to the lack of faith and courage. It is a courageous battle against human flesh. I am weak in flesh but by faith I am strong spiritually through the Word of God and the presence of the Holy Spirit who enables me to stand firm against the attacks of evil power daily.

There are ways to lose and win the battles. First is about losing the battle with the power of flesh and sin. Why is it easy to fail in our struggle with sin? We are sinners who have sinful tendencies to do wrong. We are weak, not strong even as born again Christians. Apostle Paul shared his frustration about his struggle in flesh. "Yes, I know that nothing good lives in me—I mean nothing good lives in the part of me that is earthly and sinful. I want to do the things that are good, but I do not do them. I do not do the good things I want to do, but I do the bad things I do not want to do. So if I do things I do not want to do, then I am not the one doing them. It is sin living in me that does those things" (Romans 7:18-20, NCV). Our sinful flesh wants to do things that are wrong when we are tempted. Paul made it clear that when we know it is wrong to do evil things when tempted we tend to give in to the temptation. The Bible is very clear on what are the acts of sin. "The wrong things the sinful self does are clear: being sexually unfaithful. not being pure, taking part in sexual sins, worshiping gods, doing witchcraft, hating, making trouble, being jealous, being angry, being selfish, making people angry with each other, causing divisions among people, feeling envious, being drunk, having wild and wasteful parties, and doing other things like these. I warn you now as I warned you before: Those who do these things will not inherit God's kingdom" (Galatians 5:19-21, NCV). So it very easy for us as a Christian to fall into sin even after trying to fight against it. We can't make excuse for sinning. It is our decision to sin or not to sin when tempted. We can't blame God

for our failure. It is we who are at fault. God did not promise us a life free from sins and temptations. The lust for sin come from our minds that are sinful. So then there is no hope for victory over sin? Yes, as long we focus on self we are losers.

How then can we be victorious as promised by God? Jesus is the answer. We know that He forgives us our sin, but we tend to forget that He gives us power to live victoriously. The first is justification and the second is sanctification. "I am the vine, and you are the branches. If any remain in me and I remain in them, they produce much fruit. But without me they can do nothing. If any do not remain in me, they are like a branch that is thrown away and then dies. People pick up dead branches, throw them into the fire, and burn them. If you remain in me and follow my teachings, you can ask anything you want, and it will be given to you. You should produce much fruit and show that you are my followers, which brings glory to my Father" (John 15:5-8, NCV). What is the fruit He is talking about? In Galatians 5:21, 22 it says: "But the Spirit produces the fruit of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, selfcontrol" (NCV). Now, one more for living a victorious life. Let's go back to Galatians 5 again after verses 21 and 22. "Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified their own sinful selves. They have given up their old selfish feelings and the evil things they wanted to do. We get our new life from the Spirit, so we should follow the Spirit" (Galatians 5:24, 25, NCV). Clearly, we must surrender everything in our lives to Jesus who has promised us the Holy Spirit who comes to be our Comforter and Supporter. We must allow the Holy Spirit to cleanse us from evil thoughts and sins even though we still have sinful flesh as Paul savs in Romans 7.

God promises us victory as long as we avoid places of temptation. If we are weak with alcohol we should avoid any gatherings where alcohol is flowing freely. For example, bars and parties. Don't ever expect our God to help us while we are putting ourselves in the places of temptation. God's promise is for those who obey Him. If we refuse to obey Him then how can He help us? Nothing. The choice is yours. God dont' force us. Pornography is a serious problem among Christian men and some women. It is a sin to get involved with pornography. What shall you do? Throw them away! Disconnect Internet if you cannot resist it. It is better for you to cancel your Internet than to lose eternal life because of sinning.

Southern Deaf Camp Meeting 2018

A total of 126 people gathered at beautiful Cohutta Springs Conference Center for the 13th annual Southern Deaf Camp Meeting, August 8-12, 2018. Many came in from different states, some as far as California and Washington, and a group from the Caribbean island of Barbados, for spiritual fellowship and renewal as well as recreational activities.

We were pleased to host Pastor Douglas Silva and his interpreter, Andre Oliveira, both



from Brazil in South America. Pastor Douglas is deaf himself and he is a full-time pastor serving the Deaf for the Paulistana Conference in Sao Paulo, Brazil. His theme was "The High Price for Freedom." He gave a series of four sermons in Brazilian Sign Language (called Libras), with Andre translating into spoken Portuguese. We had two translators from the Brazilian Adventist Church in the Atlanta area: Pastor Mateus Nanbu and Elder Flavio. These men, in turn, translated from Portuguese into spoken English. Melissa Jordan, Dianne Chua, Esther Doss, and Nohe Jarnes, each took turns interpreting into ASL.

A young Deaf adult, Josiah Kelly, son of Deaf Pastor Paul Kelly of New York, was the second speaker. He gave two sermons. After each sermon, a history of the Deaf work in the SDA Church was presented by Andre Oliveira. He has done much research and discovered that Brother Kimball was the first Deaf Adventist preacher who did the pioneer work in USA in the 1800s. Ellen

G. White knew him.

The morning schedule had four breakout groups: adults at the main meeting with Pastor Douglas, teens with Elder Jaycee Robinson, younger kids with Anissa Michalek, and the Adventist interpreters' workshop with Nohe Jarnes. The afternoons were free time. Some took a hike or rode mountain bicycles on the trails, some took boat rides on the lake, some swam in the lake or the swimming pool, some used the blob, rope swing, and water slide

Overall, it was a refreshing experience for many of us. Next year's camp meeting is set for August 7 to 11, 2019.

Test your habits and places through this valuable guide—Philippians 4:8. "Brothers and sisters, think about the things that are good and worthy of praise. Think about the things that are true and honorable and right and pure and beautiful and respected. Do what you learned and received from me, what I told you, and what you saw me do. And the God who gives peace will be with you" (NCV).

These ladies have been asking our DEAF (Deaf Everywhere Are Family) group to visit them for over a year (almost 2 years). Twelve SNEC DEAF members rented an extend van and drove to New York for this special DEAF event. Pastor David and Francisca Trexler also drove up from Maryland to show support and to be there for the planning meeting.

In the morning, church worship was in Spanish with simultaneous interpreting into English and then into ASL by Grace Ann Ashley and Jessica McGowan Smith. After lunch there was a planning meeting with the Deaf group in the Bronx, to help them set up their own Deaf ministry for their area and the Greater New York Conference. 

From 1952 to 1954 he went to La Sierra University and he attended Gallaudet University from 1954 to 1955. In 1955 he went back to La Sierra University and graduated from there with a BA in Theology in 1958. On March 20, 1960 he married his life time partner in Christ, Lillian Joyce McOrmond of Sudbury, Canada on March 20, 1960. They raised four children—Daniel, Ann, Scott, and Paul. Susan Bailey (now Buzzell) joined the family as a foster child.

He became the first pioneering full-time pastor for the Deaf in the United States when he was called to the ministry for the Deaf by the Southern California Conference in 1960. He spent many hours and driving miles in southern California visiting and giving Bible studies to many Deaf people from 1960 to 1968 when he was relieved from the job. At the time of the loss of his beloved job he had about 8 to 10 Deaf people who would be baptized into the Seventh-day Adventist church. Instead, his close friend John Issler who took his place and baptized some of them. After that he worked as manager of Chula Vista Health Food Store from 1968 to 1986.
