In what began as a request for materials for her Deaf brothers and sisters, Maida Ortega Abeyta approached me at the piano of the Rabbit Road English Seventh-day Adventist Church in Santa Fe, New Mexico. I had not seen her before because my duties were playing piano and she was always at the back, quiet as a little mouse who always left immediately after the sermon! I did not know she existed. Is that the case with many Deaf in Hearing churches? I think so.

Quickly Maida and I became friends and she opened her heart to express deep love and concern for the Deaf in our community who need to learn of Jesus. We gathered

some beautiful materials and soon began sending out newsletters to new interests and those already enrolled in Bible studies. When we told our new Marcy Park elder of Maida's ministry, he said, "You need your own Deaf church! Let's organize one!"

Seriously? Oh, the excitement! So that is what we have been doing with the generous sponsorship of Marcy Park Spanish Seventh-day Adventist Church leaders who want to share Jesus with the Deaf community in New Mexico as urgently as we do.

That was part of the announcement sent to the Deaf community of Adventists, interests and Bible study students in Central and Northern New Mexico. It was warmly received. That was late May 2019. Maida and I were busy visiting area churches presenting our plans and were consistently met with words and prayers of encouragement to move forward. Albuquerque Central SDA Church rallied around us. Taos Bilingual SDA Church donated pews as did our own Marcy Park Spanish SDA Church. Marcy Park placed us in their only available space—their enormous gym. Maida and I began gathering furnishings from our homes

all the while emptying our bank accounts on several occasions to further equip a new church with ample literature, Bibles, DVDs, Sabbath School quarterlies, and books. The UPS Store employees began to know us so well after many trips for printing that we now call them friends of the cause.

After an especially long workday on the Deaf church, Maida's family, some friends and I decided to get a quick bite to eat instead of laboring in the kitchen. I took my own car and followed them to return home after eating. We hugged, thanked and went our separate ways. Again, I followed behind Maida, her husband Bobby, their dog Liddy, and her brother, Frank. That was June 19, Wednesday at 5:30 P.M., one month before Deaf church was to open. Their car disappeared rounding a corner and when I caught up all I saw was smoke and their car strangely crushed on the side of the road. Not believing my eyes, I pulled over and began screaming to God and all of His angels for help. What was I seeing? A head-on collision. Would we find them all dead?

Other people began to stop and help. We found Frank getting out of the front passenger seat. Then we saw Bobby alive but stuck in the driver's seat unable to move. The engine was about to explode when someone told him to turn it off. The jaws of life were called and it took 20 men 20 minutes to get Bobby out and onto a stretcher. The back seat: Liddy, dazed but unharmed would not budge from Maida's side. Rottweilers are that way. Frank convinced her to get out and into my car. That is when we saw Maida at a 45 degree angle in the seat leaning against the door, unconscious and bleeding from her head. The paramedics worked on her as I hovered anxiously crying and bidding her "Breathe! Oh, Lord, give her breath!"

A second ambulance arrived and both Bobby and Maida were off to the hospital, Bobby with a broken knee, ribs and sternum; Maida with broken ribs, a gash at her left temple, a hole in her head, and an oddly displaced left eye. It was at midnight when she was airlifted to the regional trauma center in Albuquerque because of a brain bleed. There she would stay for the next two weeks. The Albuquerque Deaf community watched and prayed over her the entire time

while we took care of her family in Santa Fe. Bobby got a new knee and was discharged to rehab. Turned out Frank had a hand injury and a very sore body. Liddy, faithful as ever, wondered where her family went.

Maida was first to return home, twenty days before opening our Deaf church. Next was Bobby. Prayers were answered. Our gratitude knew no bounds. The devil did not win this one. He hates Christians and their plans. We could list many setbacks that were obviously the work of that evil one, yet God saw us through every single one - the accident included. Satan tried to make that his crowning work, but he could not kill what God was protecting.

After a year and six months of working with Maida, I have come to learn this: It is a Testimony of an Eyewitness - Sybil S. Naumer, hearing assistant to Maida O. Abeyta, eyewitness to the movings of the Spirit of God performing modern-day miracles too numerous to count. Encumbering circumstances, suddenly righted by the Unseen Hand would not be believed by common man. Yet this one thing we know: when a servant of the Living God says, "Yes, Lord, here am I, send me," those assisting them had best be prepared to rise up and act - otherwise, stand aside because they are going through with or without you. For when the Spirit quickens, moves and motivates the human mind to serve, those at their right hand quickly learn there is no force on earth with the ability to stop what God has placed in motion.

The New Mexico Seventh-day Adventist Church for the Deaf at Marcy Park opened on schedule at 10 A.M., July 20, 2019, with a total attendance of 12 precious souls, celebrating something they thought they would never see in our territory - a Deaf church by and for the Deaf.

Maida and Bobby continue to recover, knowing there is only One responsible for their continued existence in mission. Maida carries on with visitations and Bible studies. In the Fall of 2020, we hope to hold a large evangelistic effort by our dear friends from Three Angels Deaf Ministries, the Trexlers. Pray for us as we move forward. The devil is angry and does not like us very much. Praise the Lord! We must be doing something right!

Speaker's Dialogue: Are You Wearing the Logo of the Sabbath?

Businesses and organizations use logos to represent their companies. For example, Toyota, Kia, Apple, IBM, American Red Cross, SDA Church, etc. As you can see on the newsletter and website Three Angels Deaf Ministries has the logo of the hand ASL of "Jesus" with a bold circle with a space under the arms. It is a particular one that no other organizations has it. Our logo and name tell other people about us as a Christian Deaf organization that shares the last days' message to the world, the three angels' message in Jesus Christ. In other words we are identified with it.

God has a very special "logo" that He wants us to have it on us. "Keep my Sabbaths holy that they may be a sign between me and you, that you may know that I am the Lord your God." (Ezekiel 20:20). The "sign" is the seal of God. Are you having it on you? Sealing is happening right now. It will be important for us to have it in the last days before the close of the probation. The world needs to know the gospel of Jesus Christ including the Sabbath truth.

"The Israelites placed over their doors a mark of blood. The mark showed that they were God's property. So the children of God in the last days will have the mark God has given. They will place themselves in harmony with God's holy law. A mark is placed upon every one of God's people just similar to the mark was placed over the doors of the Hebrew homes, to protect the people from destruction. God declares, "I gave them my sabbaths, to be a sign between me and them, that they might know that I am the Lord that sanctify them."

"Every person in our world is the Lord's property, by creation and by redemption. Each person is on trial for his life. . . . Has he surrendered to God all that is His as His purchased property? All who love the Lord will be under His control, and will receive the sign, the mark of God, which shows them to be God's special property. Christ's righteousness will go before them, and the glory of the Lord will be their reward. The Lord protects every person who has His sign [logo]."

"And the LORD said to Moses, "You are

to speak to the people of Israel and say, 'Above all you shall keep my Sabbaths, for this is a sign between me and you throughout your generations, that you may know that I, the LORD, sanctify you. You shall keep the Sabbath, because it is holy for you. Everyone who profanes it shall be put to death. Whoever does any work on it, that soul shall be cut off from among his people. Six days shall work be done, but the seventh day is a Sabbath of solemn rest, holy to the LORD. Whoever does any work on the Sabbath day shall be put to death. Therefore the people of Israel shall keep the Sabbath, observing the Sabbath throughout their generations, as a covenant forever. It is a sign forever between me and the people of Israel that in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, and on the seventh day he rested and was refreshed' " (Exodus 31:12-17, ESV).

This recognition of God is of the highest value to every human being. All who love and serve Him are very precious in His sight. He would have them stand where they are worthy representatives of the truth as it is in Jesus" (Maranatha, 246).

Make sure to have a seal of God by surrendering your heart to Jesus completely. It is important to be ready now than later.

In Memory of Alberta Blake

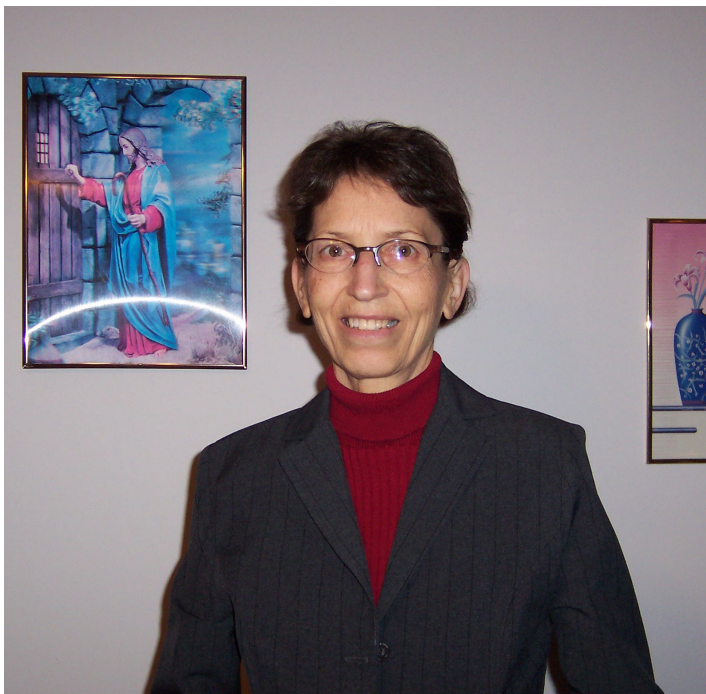

Alberta Maretta Reimche was born on July 21, 1942 in a log cabin very near the top end of Gull Lake, Lacombe County, Alberta. Her father, Albert Reimche delivered her himself. When he was a baby, Albert's family had immigrated from Crimea to the USA and not that long after, moved up to Saskatchewan. Alberta's mother, Emma Bechtold, was born near Irvine, Alberta. Emma's and Albert's parents had left Crimea at the same time and on the same boat.

Alberta grew up in a farming community and attended the Bentley SDA church. Her father helped Pastor Peter Rick as they moved the church building from a country setting into the town of Bentley. Alberta's father was both a mechanic and a farmer. When Alberta was about six years old her family moved from a farm in Bentley to the Grandview Flats area of the British Columbia (BC) Okanagan. For her elementary grades Alberta attended the local Grandview Adventist church school, but for high school, went on into the Armstrong public high school.

Alberta early learned to work—out in the fields picking potatoes and watermelons. This experience was helpful for her when she went to Canadian Union College to work in the furniture factory and take the two-year teacher training course. In 1963-64 she taught one year at the Silver Creek SDA church school.

At the end of that 1964 school year, she married John Blake, who had just graduated from theology at CUC. After their honeymoon they began pastoring the Bridgewater, Nova Scotia (NS) church. In the Spring they were asked to take over the Fredericton, Minto and Harvey churches and then work toward finishing the Zealand church. During that 16-month period they worked with five series of evangelistic meetings with Pastor John Popowich, finished the church building and helped start a major new addition to that Zealand church.

After John spent the 1966-67 school year at the Andrews University Seminary in Michigan, they moved to New Glasgow, NS where John led the new church building project. It was here they discovered that their baby, Judy, was deaf. This led the Blake's toward their work with Deaf.

They began to wonder why God would allow their daughter to be deaf. Could it be that they should consider working with the Deaf, and how would their little deaf girl get a Christian education. A training program in deaf education was just beginning at the Maritime Inter-Provincial School for the deaf. So in 1972 they moved to Amherst, NS while Alberta took this one-year specialized program. In 1973 they pastored the Dartmouth and Fox Point churches.

While still in NS, Blakes learned about a little deaf boy that needed a home that used sign language. So, after investigation, they took this little 3-year-old deaf boy (David) into their home as a welfare child.

The next year, 1974, Blakes moved to British Columbia (BC) with their two deaf children, and their two hearing girls, Joan and Jean—all born in the Maritimes! There in BC, they began to dream of starting an SDA school for the Deaf. So, during the 1974-1975 school year they began a mini school for the Deaf on the new BC Conference camp meeting grounds at Hope. But, that was too difficult when Alberta had to teach and keep another deaf student in the home.

For the next three years John and Alberta pastored the McBride SDA church. Here their family of four children grew to love the outdoors with skiing and hiking in the mountains of BC. On a trip to an SDA Deaf center in Arkansas to

get original material for a deaf video ministry they were developing, John was asked to come and be director at the school while Alberta would teach the younger students. Here is where both Judy and David began to really experience living in the culture of the Deaf, and not be like strangers in a hearing world. Altogether, Alberta taught Judy and David for 8-10 years usually in conjunction with a local Adventist church school. After three broadening years at the Deaf Center, the family moved to Lacombe, Alberta where John worked to try and establish a ministry for Deaf in the province. They began a cable TV program for Deaf which aired in Calgary, Edmonton and Red Deer as well as on the 3ABN satellite system. Alberta had a special signed story section for children at the end of each program. Jonathan and Michelle Oslund, children of deaf parents, were her live studio audience.

But, results were slow and John decided to return to regular hearing ministry as they moved to the Beauvallon/Bonnyville area. After five years they moved to the St. Albert/Onoway pastoral district. After two full years in this district, John changed to half time with Onoway and volunteered half time in Deaf Ministry. They also began working to develop Deaf Ministry in the greater Toronto area climaxing with an evangelistic series for Deaf with Elder David Trexler.

At the end of 2005, John officially “retired,” but was accepted as the Deaf Ministry department director with Gospel Outreach of College Place, WA. Deaf work had already started in India that was sponsored directly through the Canadian Union Conference, but work also began to spread to other countries such as the Philippines, Kazakhstan and to 11 countries in Central and South Africa.

Earlier, Alberta was the main reason for starting a mini camp meeting for Deaf during the first weekend of the BC Conference Camp meeting at Hope. For 17 years, Deaf came from Alberta, British Columbia, Washington and Oregon as special presenters from the USA shared their messages in Sign Language.

Unfortunately, in 1997 Alberta contracted bronchiectasis in her lungs and later found that she also had atypical Tuberculosis. This forced a big change: the camp meetings and Deaf Ministry

classes in BC stopped, and she had to give up her membership on the Adventist Deaf Ministry (currently Three Angels Deaf Ministries) board and the North American Division Deaf Ministry Committee.

But, Alberta did not give up. In 2012 she worked in helping develop a major historical display for the 100th Anniversary of the Village of Clive. She worked as Prayer Ministry Director for the Bentley SDA church. She also strongly supported the Clive Adventist Community Service Center in the little building which had been donated to them in Clive.

But, by March 25, 2019, Alberta had to move to the Lacombe Long Term Health Center for a full time care. While there, she worked to share her love of birding helping with a weekly gathering of those interested in birding.

On Sabbath morning July 13, Alberta tripped on the small oxygen pipe in her room and broke her hip. It seemed that she was recovering from the hip operation, but the morning after her 77th birthday celebration at the Red Deer hospital with family in a beautiful indoor garden, her health became worse, and passed away with her sister-in-law and deaf son at her side.

For years, Alberta had been saving Adventist Deaf Ministry newsletters and publications. She had collected pictures and gathered materials hoping to write a history of Adventist Deaf work through the last 140 years. But, as her strength waned, John could see that if it was going to be done, he needed to do the writing. Alberta could be his helper and editor. The basic writing and much of the preparation is now completed and we expect will eventually be put online on the General Conference Deaf Ministry web site for any to read.

Alberta deeply loved the Lord. Knowing her weak condition of health, Alberta had said that she was ready to die. She gave her life for her family, for those in their pastoral districts, and especially for ministry with Deaf people. We praise God for her 77 years during which time she was a blessing to so many! We long to be with her again on that resurrection morning!

On July 23 & 24, the 3ADM Board of Directors and our Speaker/Director met at the NAD building at Columbia, Maryland for our two-day session

On Tuesday we had our brainstorming session to share our concerns and ideas. Several ideas we worked on were developing an ASL Bible Dictionary, setting up a plan for storage of 3ADM furniture and inventory, seeking a location and possibly purchasing a property for an office. Then the rest of the day was used for going over our committee reports and approving them.

On Wednesday we spend the rest of the day on new business items. After much discussion we have decided that the Washington DC metro area will be the headquarters for our 3ADM office location. The next step was to have a feasibility study of purchasing property for an office in the Washington DC metro area.

We formed a new sub-committee under the Media Production Committee called the ASL Bible Dictionary Committee. The purpose of this committee is to set up standard signs for religious words instead of using several different signs for the same word used in ASL.

Bruce Buzzell, Alfred Griffith, and Paul Kelly were re-elected to another four-year term as 3ADM board members from Jan. 1, 2020 to Dec. 31, 2023. Four of the current officers were re-elected to their respective one-year terms for the 2020 fiscal year. The officers are Bruce Buzzell, Chairperson; Paul Kelly, Vice-Chairperson; Chuck McGehee, Treasurer; and Alfred Griffith, Secretary.

The 3ADM Board will meet again at the NAD building on July 28-29, 2020.

It is also home to the National Technical Institute for the Deaf (NTID) at Rochester Institute of Technology and Rochester School for the Deaf. You get to see Deaf individuals often at stores, restaurants, etc.

Now, back to the Deaf Festival, we had our 3ADM booth at the Genesee Park. The weather was good and a bit windy. We had to watch our canopy tent to be sure that it would not get blown off its site as one did. We managed to give away literatures, DVDs but not many as we anticipated but at least we got to meet with Deaf people, allowing them to see our presence. May God continues to reach out to the hearts of Deaf people, leading them to our Savior Jesus Christ.
