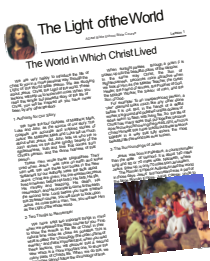
Every day she came to sit with me outside and I gave her a new recipe of another sandwich. After getting to know her I offered her to have a
