A few months before the DeafNation Expo on April 9, 2022, I booked a roundtrip flight to Austin, Texas, for Francisca and me. At the same time, I also reserved a hotel room. But when I tried to rent a car online, there was no car available through different online sites. I was surprised! I wondered what was going on there that many people were planning to go to Austin, which is one of the great cities for different festivals such as music, etc.

I didn't think that COVID-19 might have a great impact on the car rental business. So, I decided to wait and hope for some availability later. Unfortunately, fast forward to the night of April 7, a day before our departure, I forgot about it. I panicked after I tried to find a rental car. I looked at different websites that offered car rentals. Nothing, even in downtown Austin. We need a car for this trip. So, what should we do? I gave sad news to Francisca, and she was concerned. It looked like we would need Uber to take us to the exhibition center, the hotel, and then back on the next day. We prayed again, and I decided to go to an empty Fox Rental. Before seeing agents, I explained in a writing book about our situation, hoping for their sympathy. The agent read my note and said, "No car." Then I walked to the Enterprise kiosk, which was empty too. The agent said that all cars were booked, even all over Austin. I asked him if he knew if there was another way to get a car. He looked around and told me to try Budget or Avis. I thanked him and looked at Budget's long line of people, so I decided on Avis, which had three people. When it was my turn, I showed her my note. She told me to wait, and she talked with the manager. After talking with the manager, she turned her head to me smiling and said that she would help us! What! They have a car for us! After completing the contract, she gave me the key with instructions on where to get a car; I walked on "the clouds," feeling uplifted and grateful to God! Jessica was also able to see many friends that she had not seen since the start of COVID. All day we gave away many pamphlets, DVDs, books, and flyers with online content all about Jesus.

Here is a sample of some of the conversations we had and connections that were made:

- Spoke with and prayed for a friend who was told her father would die from lung cancer in 3-4 days.
- Paul Kelly had a Bible study with a Deaf man who had many questions about the Trinity (God is Father, Son and Holy Spirit). This is an important topic that recently many people have been trying to understand.
- Spoke with 2 young men about other worlds, signs of knowing Jesus is coming and how we will know to be ready using quotes from Matthew and Revelation.
- Spoke with Jonathan's friend who studied philosophy about if God exists and how

everything in the universe fits perfectly together. We also talked with him about good and evil and about hell.

These conversations show that people in the Deaf community are still hungry to know that Jesus is real, and that Jesus loves and cares about them. This shows how important it is to meet our Deaf community where they are and to share the good news about Jesus' saving love.

Please continue to pray for 3ADM's booth ministry sharing Jesus at Deaf Expos, for God's blessings on the people we met in Boston and the materials we handed out. Only in heaven will we know the true value of the connections we made for Jesus at the America Deaf Expo.

History of Adventist Deaf Ministry in North America

Alberta Blake and Elder Arthur Griffith both felt that it would be helpful to have a history of Adventist Deaf Ministry in North America. Elder Griffith sent some old pictures and various details to Alberta. It was decided that Alberta would be in charge of this history project. However, Alberta's health lessened her abilities to tackle this project, and nothing developed.

Alberta's husband, Pastor John Blake, saw what was happening and decided that if the project was going to work, he needed to be a part of it. He ended up being the writer and graphics/picture composer, with Alberta as the editor. At this time there is no plan to publish the 80 pages of history on paper, as it is now online on the General Conference Adventist Deaf Ministry website. People may read online or download what they wish to keep. The history starts with Ellen White meeting and visiting with a Deaf man, Brother Eliphalet Kimball. (Testimonies for the Church, vol. 4, p. 300) After discovering the truths of Adventist beliefs, Kimball became a real witness to hundreds of Deaf people in different areas where he lived in the USA. There is not much known about the Adventist Deaf for about the next 50 or more years. However, we have records from newsletters and many pictures starting in the 1950's and 1960's.

Adventist Deaf history has two divisions: Canada and the USA. The Blakes were involved mostly in Canada, but also worked for three years with the Christian Deaf Center in Alpena, Arkansas from 1982-1985 after which they returned to Canada. Their goal was to help develop a work for the Deaf across Canada. There are a number of sub-divisions: (1) People who have worked with Deaf Ministry, (2) Organizations involved, (3) a "A basic time-line of Deaf Ministry" highlights with a basic, roughly chronological outline of the various aspects of Deaf ministry, with three sections of pictures in each Division. The historical events bring the reader to about the year 2017. Elders Belser and Thompson Kay have each read the script to make sure the memories were as accurate as possible. A big "Thank You" goes to all the people, both Deaf and Hearing, who have contributed ideas, pictures or advice to help complete the project! Someday, perhaps a summary will be prepared to add other countries to "Deaf History." At this time in 2021, there is some measure of organized Deaf Ministry work in Canada, USA, Mexico, Inter-America, Brazil, several Caribbean countries, India, Bangladesh, Indonesia, Kyrgystan, Kazakhstan, Russia, Spain, Portugal, Ukraine, Poland, Latvia, Germany, United Kingdoms, Japan, South Korea, Australia, the Philippines, and about 12 countries of Africa: Nigeria, Ghana, Botswana, Congo, South Sudan, Rwanda, Zimbabwe, Tanzania, Uganda, Zambia, Ghana, Ethiopia, and Burundi.

The point of having an "Adventist Deaf Ministry History" is to show God's leading and inspire others to do what they can to help take the Three Angels' Messages to Deaf people everywhere! All success and glory must be given to God as it would not be of any eternal value unless God had been in charge and worked through so many willing people!

In Memory of Ron Tendrich



Ron Tendrich who was born in Miami. Florida. on September 29, 1943, passed away in Lincoln, Nebraska on March 15, 2022. He was buried in Miami, Florida on March 22, 2022. In Lincoln, he met and married Betty, who is now a survivor, along with her three sons.

In Memory of Glenda Palmer-Reese



Glenda June Palmer-Reese was born September 28, 1964, in Trelawny, Jamaica, the youngest of five children, and a pleasant surprise to her parents, Dr. J.C. and Ina May Palmer. When five months old, she developed a severe infection with very high fevers and seizures. Her frantic parents tried everything to get the fever down, including putting her in an ice bath, but by the time they got her to the hospital, she had completely lost her hearing permanently, and her convulsions ultimately led to epilepsy and lifelong medications to control it.

As a child, she attended the School for the Deaf in Brown's Town, Jamaica, with an emphasis on lip-reading. At age 10, the family moved to Berrien Springs, Michigan, where she was introduced to sign language. She was overloved to discover a language just for her, without the stigma or difficulty of being silent in a hearing world. In Michigan, she was diagnosed with scoliosis, and had to have back surgery and wear a body brace 23 hours a day for five years. In spite of these challenges, she was always a precocious little girl, enjoying life, especially if it involved playing table tennis, her favorite game. For her dad, both she and sister, Jaycee, were the apple of his eye, and because of Glenda's health challenges, her parents tried to "protect" her from the outside world.

That all changed when they met Pastor Thompson Kay, affectionately known as TK. Not only was he special to them because of his role in deaf ministry, but he encouraged Dr. and Mrs. Palmer to help Glenda develop her independence. When they moved to Orlando, Florida, where Dr. Palmer became the pastor of the Pine Hills SDA Church, she was able to exercise her independence by getting her own apartment ... with help from mom.

On July 19, 2009, Glenda married Clarence Reese. Their happy marriage was cut short by his untimely death in February, 2010. She worked at various jobs in Orlando, including Sea World. She valued work and earning her own income, and she was able to bless others with Sea World passes. She worked there until 2017, when additional health challenges caused her to stop working.

As a little girl, her dad and mom constantly prayed for Glenda to be healed of her deafness. But God had a better plan—they became pioneers in deaf ministry. Everywhere the Palmers went, she and mom would start a sign language ministry. She attended Pine Hills, now Solid Rock SDA church with mom, and would visit the Patmos SDA church often because of their deaf ministry. When she learned about Southern Deaf Fellowship, she was elated to see sermons in her very own language with Pastor Jeff Jordan.

Glenda fell asleep in Jesus on March 6, 2022. She is survived by her brothers, Mr. Elsworth Palmer (Delores), Dr. Schubert Palmer (Yolanda), Pastor Leighton Palmer (Joanne); sister, Mrs. Jaycee Robinson (Kenneth); nephews, Mr. Michael Fitzgerald (Yanina), Mr. Quinton Fitzgerald, Mr. Shelton Palmer (Nina), Mr. Shaun Palmer (LaKeisha); nieces, Miss Nikki Palmer, Mrs. Quileen Adams (Duane), Miss Angela Davis, Mrs. Nieshiea Mitchell (Donald), Miss Kuirie Palmer, Miss Lisa Fleming, Miss Tamay Robinson, "adopted" siblings, Ms. Beverly Francis, Ms. Verona Ebanks, Mrs. Enid Thompson Jean-Baptiste, Mr. Joshua Allen, Pastor Kenneth Campbell, Mr. Lanford Brown, Mr. Wayne Clarke, Mrs. Donnette James-Samuel, and many family & friends.

When Mike moved into a new home a few years ago, we lost touch for a brief time. He connected again with the Deaf through zoom Sabbath School every Sabbath until his death. He brought smiles and jokes every Sabbath to our Zoom meeting. Mike was one of the first to join and the last to leave. He loved to pray for our meetings.

Mike suffered a heart attack on June 1, 2022 and went to sleep in Jesus. We hold on to the blessed hope that Mike is now resting in Jesus and we will see him when Christ rises him up from his sleep! Then we will go to Heaven, where there will be no more death and sadness! (Revelation 21:3-4).
