Waves dashing against a rocky coast. An eagle flying high above the valley floor. A doe with her fawn drinking from a still, blue lake. These tell us of God’s care. What would it be like if you had no eyes to see the blues, golds, and crimsons of an autumn day? What if you could not hear the thundering of a waterfall or the beat of rain upon your roof? What if you could not see the early morning sun turning dew drops into diamonds? What if you could not hear the soft purr of your kitten? What if you were blind and deaf?

Hellen Keller was blind and deaf. When she was 19 months old her world suddenly became dark, silent, and frightening. It continued that way until her teacher, Anne Sullivan, taught her about the world through the sense of touch.

When Hellen was 10 years old, her parent decided it was time to teach her about God. They asked a pastor friend to come to their home and talk to her about the Creator. With Miss Sullivan as interpreter, he spoke to Helen about the mountains, sky, sea, birds, flowers, and animals. He told her that the Maker of the beautiful world in which she lived was called God.

Helen’s face smiled with joy and understanding. Quickly she spelled out with her fingers, “I have known Him all the time, but I never knew His name.”

God has given you eyes that you might see His power in a sprouting bean. He has given you ears that you might hear His voice in the pounding wave. He has given you a nose that you might sense His love you smell the honeysuckle fragrance. He has given you fingers

that you might feel the softness of a baby’s hand and know He cares for you. He has given you a tongue to taste the sweetness of a strawberry, and by so doing know Him better.

Someone is our God who is Yahweh—“the self-existing being.” We thank God daily for us to be able to sign for effective communication for enjoyment and learning. Praise the Lord! Let us not be discouraged about what is happening to us and the world. God is caring for us daily.

The DMC met February 7th on Zoom. The committee voted to use the money to help the Interpreter's Conference and a Deaf Youth Camp in Washington. The Adventist Church appreciates *The Deaf Messenger* magazine, the Deaf Bible School, the outreach at Deaf Nation Expo and other events, live streaming and sermons on DVD, and much more.
