DVDs Used Around the World

Contrary to popular belief, American Sign Language (ASL) is not universal. Many different sign languages are used around the world, such as Auslan in Australia and LIBRAS in Brazil. British Sign Language uses both hands for the alphabet, unlike ASL. Even our Mexican neighbors have their own sign language that do not resemble ASL at all. The first time I met a Deaf person from Mexico, I was fascinated by Mexican Sign Language and learned to sign some. Ironically, the only sign that looked the same as ASL was the word *same*; I had to laugh! However, ASL and sign languages originating from ASL are used in many areas around the world.

Resources for Deaf ministry are very limited. This is more true

Speaker's Dialogue: Life is Very Short as Vapor

Recently, we have heard much tragic news about people who died unexpectedly and suddenly. For example, an AirAsian airliner was lost, went into the sea and killed over 160 passengers. Some teenagers were killed by police. Terrorists killed innocent people. And many men and women died suddenly due to strokes and heart attacks. None of these people expected to die so soon! We do not know when we will die. Many of us will die without warning.

King Solomon expressed with sadness that our life is in vain. We all enjoy the pleasures of life but it does not last forever. An artist takes a step back and look at his beautiful painting. He is proud of his achievement and then suddenly falls to the floor due to a heart attack. We have known young people who just graduated from high school with big dreams for their futures, only to die suddenly in a car accident. I think especially about those who suddenly died without the hope of eternal life through Jesus Christ. They did not want to die; they had plans to live. Sadly, in many cases, death could have been avoided.

The book of James clearly pointed out the futility of planning for a future of wealth and fun when not living in Christ. "Come now, you who say, 'Today or tomorrow we will go to such and such a city, spend a year there, buy and sell, and make a profit'; whereas you do not know what will happen tomorrow. For what is your life? It is even a vapor that appears for a little time and then vanishes away" (James 4:13-14 NKJV).

Ask yourself these questions: Are you walking with Jesus who came to die for you? Do you realize how short life is? Do you think that God is so loving that He will not allow you to die until you come back to Him after many years of sinful pleasures?

Yes, God wants all of us--good and bad to be saved! Jesus died for all of us, good and bad. But God cannot forgive sins that we are not truly sorry for. Two more questions: Do you say, "I love Jesus," hoping that will impress God while at the same time you rebel against Him? Do you believe God will not allow death or consequences happen to you while you resist the Holy Spirit and make excuses for not following God? These are dangerous thoughts.

Most of us try to push the limit of God's patience. Remember God gives us the freedom of choice. It is up to us whether or not we have eternal life, not our beloved God! God allows you to choose whatever


kind of life you want to live--good or bad. Our bad choices hurts Him but He does not force us to go back to Him.

Remember Lot's wife. Angels "forced" Lot and his family out of Sodom before destruction came. But Lot's wife rebelled against the command of the merciful God and died immediately upon turning her head to see the burning city she loved. God saved them physically but He cannot save her spiritually because she resisted His love and care. What was in her heart so was she!

Are we playing with fire? If you do not go to church or follow the Bible as your only guide, are you thankful that you are still alive through God's grace? Do you realize that at any moment you could be dead and not even know what happened to you? Would you be lost?

Do not assume that you are okay because nothing has happened to you while living outside of Christ. Satan lies to us and one of his best known lies is that we can always come to God at a later time and still be safe. Remember Eve? She lost everything because she believed Satan's lie. She disobeyed the plain words of God because she thought God would not harm her for a little thing. Also, many people accuse God of using fear so people will obey Him. What do you think? Do you think the same? If you do then your life is a mist!

Brothers and sisters, my friends, repent! Now is the time to wake up from the sleep of sin and false feeling of safety! You will have a full life when you are in Christ. You will have the assurance of eternal life, no matter if you lose your job, home, friends, or family because of your faith in Him. Do not get mad at God if something bad happens to you. Apostle Peter encourages us to rejoice in difficult times because of our faith in Jesus. We hate troubles but we cannot avoid them. We live in a cruel world but it is a mist!! Rejoice in The Lord! Why? Because Jesus is coming back soon, sooner than we think! Our sufferings are but for a short time when compared with eternal life, full of joy and adventure.

Deaf Theology Student Graduates in Brazil


December 6th was a historic day for the Deaf work in Brazil. On this day, Douglas Silva was the first Deaf Adventist theology student to graduate from Faculdade Adventista Da Amazonia near Belem, Brazil. Douglas is also the first Deaf pastor in South America!

Visitors traveled from North America to witness this special event and to show their support. Among them were Pastor Jeff and Missy Jordan. Pastor Jeff is the first Deaf Adventist to graduate with a M. Div. degree from the SDA Theological Seminary at Andrews University and, currently, is the only paid pastor serving in North America. Pastor Jeff and Missy were asked to present Pastor Douglas and his wife Karen a special plaque during the graduation service.

Pastor Douglas Silva was not born Deaf, but rather, he lost his hearing as a young person. Soon after he became an Adventist, he began sharing his new found faith. He and his wife soon became very active and realized that they were called by God to the ministry. Pastor Douglas left a very good paying job and pursued a theology degree at the Adventist college. During his four years of study, a very special

lady, Nazare Ribeiro Aires, sacrificed her time and energy to interpret classes for Pastor Douglas without any pay.

Pastor Douglas's wife Karen is also very active in Deaf ministry; the two work wonderfully as a pastoral team. They are now working in the Paulistanas Conference in Sao Paulo, Brazil, the largest city in Brazil and in the top three largest cities in the world.





across the division. Each November, the committee meets to decide how to use the funds the NAD sets aside specifically for Deaf work. The committee also lays plans and discuss challenges and ideas. The use of the funds are carefully considered before allocation. Some funds have been granted to 3ADM for projects. The funds have been used to sponsor events and other projects. The NAD leans heavily on 3ADM to meet many of the committee's goals.

NAD Vice President Debra Brill chairs the committee of nine voting members; seven of them are Deaf. 3ADM has a permanent place on the committee with the Speaker/Director serving as an ex-officio member with no voting privileges.

3ADM deeply appreciates the support we receive from the NAD Deaf Ministries Committee.

New Webinars by DYAC

The Deaf Young Adults for Christ (DYAC) meet once a year for camp meeting, but leaders and attendees sensed that was not enough. DYAC developed webinars as a way to continue meeting together throughout the year. What is a webinar? A webinar is a live event held online. A live video of the speaker is seen through an application for computers, tablets, or smartphones. Interaction among the attendees is usually limited to a chat window.

Last December, DYAC hosted its first webinar with a presentation by Pastor Paul Kelly. He talked about how to grow in Christ without quitting. During the presentation, rich in ASL and visual aids, Pastor Kelly suggested that keeping our eyes on Jesus is the same as a flower turning to follow the sun. Those who attended were able to ask questions and have a discussion during and after the presentation with the help of a facilitator. About 25 people joined the webinar, and many of them expressed excitement. This experience provides SDA Deaf young adult members opportunities for hands-on experience planning these events and facilitating the presentations and discussions. DYAC plans to schedule these webinars on a monthly basis with presentations by strong students of the Bible and facilitated by young adults. The second one was held January 25th with David Trexler. The webinars are open to Deaf people of all ages.

DYAC also hopes to add a second session for a Bible Questions and Answers panel discussion. DYAC is also working towards posting videos of each webinar on their website so that the message will continue to be


