Meetings in Fresno, California Reaps Baptisms!

The Truth for Today, Hope for Tomorrow prophecy seminars with 3ADM Speaker/Director David Trexler was presented to the Deaf community in Fresno, California. A total of 16 meetings in 3 weeks were held starting on Tuesday, March 31st and ending on Sabbath, April 18th. The first seven meetings took place in the large conference room at the Deaf and Hard of Hearing Service Center where many Deaf people often get counseling, peer and job assistance, and attend social events.

David Trexler is Deaf himself and uses sign language to preach to Deaf people in their own language. Keeping in mind that reaching the Deaf population is difficult, the net result of these meetings were excellent! Six Deaf people decided that they wanted to be baptized!

baptized at the Madera SDA Church by Pastor David Dean. LeRoy Cano was a former Deaf Sunday-keeping church pastor in Merced. He has substitued as a pastor for the Fresno Deaf Church. Wendy Kaestner is a friend of Sylvia Cano. All three candidates attended two evangelistic meetings at the Madera SDA church a year apart through a sign language interpreter. But when the Deaf evangelist preached

clearly in sign language, they understood Biblical truths. The Sabbath and State of the Dead are important truths that Satan failed to hide from them.

Jerry and Judy Blessing and Robert Snider were baptized June 6th at the Fresno Central SDA Church by Pastor Gary Jensen. Jerry and Judy Blessing had previously attended the Deaf congregation of the Fresno Central SDA Church. The prophecy seminar in sign language is what finally led them to decide to completely follow Jesus. Robert Snider had been regularly attending SDA church for a while. The message of hope and love compelled him

to be baptized. These three new members will continue to attend the Fresno Central Church and the church services for the Deaf led by Bob Plubell in the Central Valley Deaf Ministries room.

The Central Valley Deaf Ministries consists of groups at three sister churches in Madera, Fresno, and Porterville. Bob Plubell and Stephanie Walters are the leaders and five interpreters also serve. The Deaf church family has ten members and many non-members! Pray that Deaf ministries will be blessed to witness and to teach the Deaf population about Jesus.

Speaker's Dialogue: Is California Really in a Drought?

California is experiencing its fourth year of drought. The governor declared an emergency water restriction management asking for 25% of reduction in water use. This drought is historic. For at least 75 years the snow pack in the Sierra Mountains have been measured. For the first time, the recent measurements showed that the snow pack was only 5% of normal. In the past, the record low measurement was 25% of normal! This drought is extremely serious. In fact, one measurement at Phillips Station, 90 miles east of Sacramento, was done on bare grass for the first time! The average snow depth there is 66.5 inches. But this year, there is no snow!

The weather has been so dry! As an example, Tahoe City got only 19.5 inches of snow between October and March. They normally get about 163 inches! As you can imagine, many people in California are praying for the end of the drought. What will happen in 2016 if the drought continues?

However, there is good news for, in contrast, there is no drought in Fresno and its outlying cities. Yes these places are in drought from lack of natural rain and snow. But it is drenched with a lot of spiritual rain, the rain of the Holy Spirit. 2015 saw Deaf baptisms through friendship and public evangelism. In addition, there are more Deaf interests in the three angels' messages.

I arrived in a parched, but yet thriving city of Fresno. How different the city was from my home in Maryland which was drenched with a lot rain and snow. It had been 15 years since I had given an evangelistic series in the region. In 2000, I worked with my right hand man, Bob Plubell in Escondido, California. I remained in Fresno for three weeks, giving 16 sermons to many Deaf people in the community. Some sermons were long but none of the Deaf visitors were getting tired during the meetings. They were in full attention. They seemed to have been so thirsty from the long spiritual drought; they kept drinking the Water of Life. I was very impressed with their enthusiasm and questions. Praise the Lord the total of six Deaf people who have been baptized! I encourage you to read Bob Plubell's report on the evangelism.

2015 is an important year for the Seventh-day Adventist church. This year, the world church will have its General Conference Session when church leaders, workers and delegates from all around the world will attend the church business meetings. The General Conference has been encouraging the members and leaders to participate in the 100 Days of Prayer in preparation for the GC Session.

The church needs the outpouring of the Holy Spirit to help delegates and leaders make the right decisions during the session, which will affect the working operations of the church all over the world. Some sensitive issues need to be resolved. It is very important for us as the children of God to submit our lives to God. If we allow Him to, God will guide us in



the right way so that He will be glorified. It is easy for us to express our own human ideas and strongly support them instead of seeking out God's will, even in church business meetings.

We are in a very different world—a far cry from when I was baptized into the remnant church in 1969! So, it is urgent for the church to be ready for the great events in the future. We are facing serious global problems that we have never seen before in earth's history. But instead of improving, in the near future the world's problems will be far worse than we are experiencing today. Be aware that these problems can shake our faith in God.

Jesus wants us to perfect our character in Christlikeness before He comes to claim us as His own. We have waited too long for the second advent of Jesus Christ. "Ask the LORD for rain in the time of the latter rain. The LORD will make flashing clouds; He will give them showers of rain, grass in the field for everyone" (Zechariah 10:1).

Deaf Young Adults for Christ Camp Meeting

On June 3-7, Deaf Young Adults for Christ (DYAC) met at Gallaudet University in Washington, DC for its annual camp meeting. The theme was "Stand Firm."

DYAC members met with key church leaders invested in Deaf ministry during a planned activity. As DYAC toured the Seventh-day Adventist Church's world headquarters in Silver Spring, MD, they met with President Ted Wilson in his office. Together they prayed for unity, the church leaders' important work during the General Conference Session and Deaf ministry. After viewing beautiful souvenirs of fellowship in other countries, they were invited by President Wilson to visit the Ellen G. White Estate, not yet open to the public, and provide feedback on the accessibility of this newly expanded museum.

This visit encouraged DYAC members to learn more about the structure and issues within our church. DYAC members met with North American Division (NAD) President Dan Jackson, NAD Vice President Debra Brill, and General Conference's Associate Director of Stewardship Ministries Larry Evans. Elder Larry Evans is also the Executive Director of Adventist Deaf Ministries International. They shared exciting updates about long-awaited advances to bring access to the Gospel for Deaf.

The camp meeting's guest speaker was Alan Meis, a teacher at Battle Creek SDA Academy. He suggested four keys to "Stand Firm" with Christ, the theme. Beginning with 1 Corinthians 15:58 during each presentation, he showed how standing firm with Jesus is connected continuous private prayer, daily Bible study, regular fellowship with brothers and sisters in Christ, and getting up every time we fall.

Everyone deeply enjoyed the fellowship and went home spiritually high.

Besides an annual camp meeting, DYAC offers weekly interactive online Bible studies led by participants. DYAC also provides monthly webinars presented by strong students of the Bible and facilitated by young adults. Participants become involved as committee members, facilitators, and Bible students or teachers. This has been possible with the North American Division Deaf Ministries Committe's support.

These monthly meetings are critical for the Deaf who are isolated, geographically dispersed and have no access to Deaf churches or interpreters. Zimbabwe Deaf Evangelism

In May, hundreds of people traveled to the African country of Zimbabwe as part of a huge evangelism effort. Evangelistic meetings, free medical treatment, and other activities resulted in over 30,000 baptisms. The Deaf were not forgotten. GC President Ted Wilson's meetings in Chitungwiza near the capital city Harare were interpreted into sign language. Two Deaf men were among the very first who decided to be baptized. Since then, a total of 5 Deaf persons were baptized into the Adventist faith.

As a specific way to reach out to Deaf people, a cooking class was held. At least 17 non-Adventist Deaf attended regularly and was attracting more. Keep the Deaf in Zimbabwe in prayer!



In Memory

James Manuel of Upper Lake California passed away in San Francisco on May 7. 2015. He was born November 17, 1941 in Santa Monica. An avid gardener, James was a multiple ribbonwinner at the Lake County Fair. His prized entry was always something out of his garden; often it was related



to the grape "tree" that he planted shortly after moving to Upper Lake in 1969. James was a life-long Seventhday Adventist who considered the Lakeport church his home. He was proud of having been recently named a deacon of the church. He volunteered countless hours to the church and its school, Westlake Adventist School, including teaching sign language to numerous students over the years. James lost his hearing due to measles as a toddler. During his lifetime, James found numerous ways to provide for his family, they included: gardener, welder, upholstery, and recently beekeeper. This last endeavor allowed him to provide for his church family. As the bees produced honey, he was able to sell much of it and donate the money to the school. He is survived by a brother, sister, three children and six grandchildren. His memorial service was held May 23rd.

About 40 to 50 people attended and asked many questions related to her presentations.

There's very few Deaf people in North America with the kind of training that Francisca has. She felt that the meetings were helpful and that the trip was well worth it and was a blessing to others.

Sixty-six visitors and members came for the special Sabbath, including Debra Brill, North American Division VP and Stan and Glenda Patterson.
