A New Leader for Adventist Possibility Ministries

I am pleased to introduce Pastor Doug Venn as the new leader for Adventist Possibility Ministries. He began on November 1. I was asked to help in the transition [change] until April 1 which is often the case with key [important] roles when there is a leadership change at the General Conference.

Pastor Venn and I share a special connection, as we both started our ministry in the same conference and had a focus on church planting. We both worked at summer camps and earned the Master Guide award. While my doctorate [study for doctor's degree] was in church growth, Pastor Venn is currently pursuing [studying] a doctorate [doctor's degree] in missions.

Although we have some similarities [things in common], Pastor Venn brings unique qualities to his leadership role. He served as a missionary in foreign [other] countries, including Thailand and the Philippines, while I later became the conference Director for Multicultural Ministries in the United States. He previously served as the Director for the Global Mission Urban Center, with a focus on equipping [helping] leaders to plant churches in cities. As I leave my leadership role with both Adventist Deaf Ministries International and Adventist Possibility Ministries, I wish to assure [tell] you that this ministry has become part of me. I'm leaving the position but not the ministry. I look forward to supporting Pastor Doug, the Deaf, and others with the belief that "all are gifted, needed, and treasured." It has been a special privilege [honor] to work with the Deaf around the world. It is my firm [strong] belief that the Church is not whole without the Deaf becoming active in all areas of the Church's life and its mission.




