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Come Out of Her My People

In the Bible, Jesus warns about nation going against nation, famines, pestilences and earthquakes in many different places around the world (Matthew 24:7). We are seeing that happening now, affecting our lives. Not only that, Jesus also warns about false christs and false prophets who are trying to fool God's people into believing lies and false teachings (v. 24). Revelation, the last book in the Bible,

also warns God's people. Those warnings are God's act of love. He wants to save us from Satan's trap. Jesus clearly says that God loves the world. He does not want anyone to die but to have everlasting life (John 3:16). Hear the words of Revelation 14:8 and 18:2, 4, 5: "Babylon is fallen ... and is become the habitation [home] of devils." "Come out of her my people ... that you receive not her plagues. For her sins

have reached unto heaven, and God hath remembered her iniquities” (KJV). This message is clear, calling people to “come out of Babylon” or be lost. We will look into further what Babylon the Great is doing and what will become of it in the end.

Babylon that John spoke about in Revelation is not real Babylon in Iraq. Today, this city is still broken down and will never be rebuilt. Saddam Hussein, a former Iraq dictator tried to rebuild it and failed. Isaiah 13:19-21 (NIRV) says that “No one will ever live in Babylon again. No one will live there for all time to come.” Obviously, Babylon as mentioned in Revelation 17 is the spiritual Babylon.

In Revelation 17:3-5, Babylon is a symbol of a woman sitting on a scarlet (red) beast. She is dressed in purple and scarlet. She is covered with gold and expensive stones and pearls. Her name was written as “Mystery, Babylon the Great, the Mother of Harlots and of the Abominations of the earth.” We have learned from a previous article that a woman in prophecy is a symbol of a church. The woman in chapter 12 is God’s true church. She is

clothed with the sun (v.1). John describes her as clothed with fine, clean and bright linen. It means the righteous acts of the saints (Revelation 19:8). The woman in chapter 17 shows to be completely different in how she is dressed. This sinful woman is a symbol of the fallen church (Jeremiah 3:1-8, 13:27). Also, she was drunken with the blood of the saints and of the martyrs of Jesus (Revelation 17:6). Clearly, this woman is a symbol of Papal Rome that attacked God’s people for 1,260 years (Daniel 7:21,25; Revelation 12: 6,14; 13:5,7). Even the New Catholic Encyclopedia says Babylon is a symbol of Rome! The sinful woman holds a cup “full with abominations” filled with shameful, disgusting false teachings. This is not the cup of salvation David prayed for (Psalms 116:13).

Since Babylon the Great is also the mother of harlots, Papal Rome claims to be the mother church and the Protestants are her daughters that pulled away from her. Many Protestants still keep some of Papal Rome’s false teachings. This mother of harlots is spiritual Babylon who made people of the earth to be “drunk with from the wine of her sexual sin [false teachings].”

(Revelation 17:2). The beast that the woman sits on is a symbol of the nations—civil or political powers. This woman as a fallen church guides and controls the nations, using their power to fight against God’s people and change times and law during 1,260 years (Daniel 9:25, Revelation 12: 6,14; 13:5-7).

The book of Daniel says that Papal Rome will continue until Jesus’ second coming. Daniel 7:26 says that the “court shall be seated” [judgment] and it will take away Papal Rome’s (the little horn’s) controlling power and it will be destroyed in the end when Jesus comes again. Take a look how Papal Rome fell and rose again as described in Revelation 13:3, 17:8 God describes the beast power: “the beast that was, and is not, and yet is” (NKJV). This mysterious phrase speaks of the political power of Papal Rome as described below:

WAS—During 1260 years of Papal control from A.D. 538 to 1798 (Revelation 13:5, 7)

IS NOT—Time of Papal Rome’s temporary loss of power—deadly wound until fully recovered in the last day (13:3). It lost its power in 1798 temporarily when

General Berthier of France arrested the pope.

YET IS—At that time, many thought that Papal Rome would not rise in power again but the world was surprised that it did. Revelation 13:3 says that its deadly wound will heal and will come out of “bottomless pit” (Revelation 17:8) and people will “marvel.” In 1929, Mussolini, an Italian dictator, restored the Papal States that Papal Rome lost temporarily. Papal Rome’s “deadly wound” is healing and is rising in power since then. Wikipedia.com says that the pope was so popular due to his being “one of the world’s most powerful people because of his diplomatic, cultural, and spiritual influence on 1.3 billion Catholics and beyond” (adapted). But, Papal Rome eventually will lose its power forever as it will “go to perdition [destruction]” (Revelation 17:8). Just as said in Daniel 7:26, it will be destroyed forever at the end of God’s judgment when Jesus comes again.

As for the beast with seven heads mentioned in Revelation 17:9-11, especially that five heads are “fallen”, who are these heads? An angel mentions that “the seven heads are seven mountains on which

the woman sits.” “Mountain” in prophecy represents king or nation (Jeremiah 51:24, 25). It is important to know that there are seven different powers mentioned in the Scripture that often oppose God’s people as shown below:

Five are fallen (v. 10)

1. Babylon (Daniel 7:4)
2. Medo-Persia (Daniel 7:5)
3. Greece (Daniel 7:6)
4. Pagan Rome (Daniel 7:7)
5. Papal Rome (Daniel 7:8, 25, Revelation 13:1, 5, 6) It spoke great words against God. Its beast eventually got a deadly wound (Revelation 13:3). It lost its power temporarily after 1260 years.

***One is** (v. 10)

6. Papal Rome—It recovers from a deadly wound and continues to rise in power. We are now living in this time of the 6th head, especially that we are in an era of separation of church and state. We have a republic government of USA symbolized by two-horned beast (Revelation 13:11).

***Has not yet come** (v. 10)

7. Papal Rome—Papal Rome has not yet reached its full power that it had before.

Horns without crowns

Revelation 17:1, 2 shows

that the kings committed fornication (sex) with the great harlot (Papal Rome). They went to “bed” with the harlot following her guidance and false teachings. Papal Rome involves the kings attacking God’s people during 1260 years. As the time goes by, people in many nations get fed up with the controlling power of kings and Papal Rome. This eventually leads Papal Rome to lose its power temporarily in 1798 when France sent its general to arrest the pope. The pope then died in the prison. Since then, many kings either give up or lose their thrones and their kingdoms. This is why the scarlet beast is shown to have horns but no crowns (Revelation 17:7, 12). The beast of Revelation 13:1 has horns with crowns which means the kings used to have ruling power during the 1260 years but not afterwards. Many countries set up their republic governments that run by their people, not the kings.

***He is the 8th and is of the**

7th (v. 11)

8. Papal Rome

The beast does not have an 8th head, only 7 heads. The 8th is telling us that the 7th head is yet to come to

power and will finally rise to its greatest power and authority with full support from ten kings (nations) of the whole world (Revelation 17:12,13). The nations will unite together as “one mind” (v. 13), supporting Papal Rome fighting against Christ and His people (v.14). However, their power will “continue for a short time” or last for “one hour” (Revelation 17:10, 12). They will come to their own destruction (Revelation 17:8,11) as Christ will overcome them at the second coming (v.14).

God’s people who choose to come out of Babylon and stand loyal to the Lamb, will face bitter attack. They eventually will be caught up during the second coming to meet the Lord in the mid-air (1 Thessalonians 4:16-18). The nations that follow the beast and the harlot will realize that they have been fooled and lost their hope of eternal life. They will turn their hatred against the harlot, “burn” her “with fire” (Revelation 17:16). This will be the end of Papal Rome. The kingdom of the world will “be given to the people of the saints of the most High, whose kingdom is an everlasting kingdom” (Daniel 7:27).

God is calling you and me

to carry out the three angel’s messages (Revelation 14:6-9), warning people to come out of Babylon and not to take part of her sins as it is fallen. Let us remain faithful and not fall into any deceptions created by Babylon the Harlot. Let us hear Jesus’ musical voice saying “Well done, you good and faithful servant” (Matthew 25:21).

*Presently, we have several prophetic interpretations. While we continue our relationship with Christ and study His words daily, we will be able to read and understand prophecy better as it becomes clearer when we get closer to Christ’s coming.



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Victory in Jesus

Many of you are familiar with the Declaration of Independence, but how many of you know the events that surround it? Just getting a Declaration was a miracle.

The Revolutionary War started in April of 1775, over a year before we declared our independence. In the early parts of the war, America was not interested in independence. Supporters of independence were considered crazy. We just wanted to solve the problems with England. But, England was clearly not interested in it.

By 1776, attitudes began to change. Britain repeatedly rejected any plans of reconciliation. Britain kept sending large armies to America to force the colonies into submission. Americans began to feel that

independence was the only option left. Independence was also necessary to receive French, Spanish, and Dutch help, which the Continental Army needed.

North Carolina became the first colony to push for independence, in April of 1776. Other colonies soon followed. In June, Richard Henry Lee of Virginia proposed a resolution to declare that America was independent of Britain. A few days later, a committee of five men was chosen to write a document to support independence. Thomas Jefferson wrote it, and his draft was edited. On July 1, only nine colonies approved it. On the next day, the document was approved with twelve colonies in favor to one abstaining (New York).

On July 4, 1776, the final

version of the Declaration of Independence was approved by Congress.

Even though we had declared independence, we had to prove that our weak and untrained army could defeat Britain, which had the best army in the world. After we declared our independence, America suffered a lot in the war. It seemed that Britain might crush our army into nothing.

But, the important patriot victory in the Battle of Saratoga of October 1777 was a turning point in the war [changed for better]. Our victory convinced France, Spain, and Holland that they could safely support our cause. We had not only declared our independence but proved that we could win it.

The Bible teaches us that there is going to be a day when Christ will return. Christ Himself said that He would return in John 14:3: "After I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back. Then I will take you to be with me so that you may be where I am." Christ promises that He will come again and take us to be with Him. While we look around at the world and some people may wonder, "where is Christ and why is He slow in coming back?" God is not delayed. His

timing is perfect! 2 Peter 3:9 says, "The Lord is not slow in doing what he promised—the way some people understand slowness. But God is being patient with you. He does not want anyone to be lost. me about the troubles and problems as blessings to them, but they do not understand. They thought that the problems and troubles are curses. It is not true as long as we are in Christ. The problems and troubles that we all experience bring us closer to God. Remember 1 Peter 5:7, "Give all your worries to him, because he cares about you. He means that we all give our problems and troubles to Jesus for He will take care of them for us. Actually, we all alone could not handle them well because they might be too much for us. So, let us remember Apostle Paul made it through, no matter how bad he suffered in his life. Here is what Apostle Paul wrote: Philippians 2:13, "because God is working in you to help you want to do and be able to do what pleases him."

Now let us focus on the word, faith. Faith is trust and belief in God. We need to be more careful in what we trust. See the Bible, 1 Corinthians 2:5, "This was so that your faith would be in God's power and not in human wisdom." This verse tells us that we should not depend the wisdom of men, but we depend on the power of God. That is the reason why we need to understand

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The Purpose and Blessings of Giving Tithe

The Bible tells us that the tithe is holy and belongs to God. “All the tithe of the land... is the Lord’s. It is holy to the Lord” (Leviticus 27:30). What is the tithe? The tithe is a tenth (1/10 or 10%) part of our income (what we earn). So here we see that a tenth of our income or any increase in materials belongs to God. The tithe is holy because it belongs to God.

What should we do with the tithe? Let’s read Malachi 3:10: “Bring all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be food in My house.” In Old Testament times, the Jews brought their tithes

along with their sacrifices and offerings to the tabernacle (See Deuteronomy 12:11). The priests and the tabernacle used God’s tithe for food and clothes. If there was no tithe then there will be no priest services and there will be no remission (forgiveness, pardon) of their sins. God did not want priests to work in the fields to earn wages to support their families because their service as priests in the tabernacle were more important.

God presents a strong warning to people who do not pay tithe. God is telling

them that they are robbing God. Let's read it in Malachi 3:8:

“Will a man rob God? Yet you have robbed Me! But you say ‘In what way have we robbed You?’ In tithes and offerings. You are cursed with a curse, for you have robbed Me.”

God places a curse on people for refusing to support priests and neglecting people who truly need to give sacrifices for remission of sins. Although we do not have the tabernacle or sanctuary services anymore, God still needs us to help our pastors and our church staff. God expects His people to give tithes and offerings to help full-time workers share the gospel. God called us to work with God by giving back 10% from all the money we receive. Not paying the tithe hurts God's work.

In the book, *Christ's Object Lessons*, it says about the benefits of giving tithe and offerings, "As the Giver of every good blessing, God claims a part [tithe and offerings] of all we own. This is His way of supporting the preaching of the gospel. And by giving back a tithe to God, we show our appreciation for His gifts" (p. 144, adapted).

Tithing also helps us accept God's ownership over all things and that we trust

Him to provide for our needs. God promises in Philippians 4:19, saying "God shall supply all your needs according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus."

What is God's plan for offerings? Offerings are used to give testimony of praise to God, to support His mission on earth, and to provide for His church to help the needy. With offerings, the goal in our hearts is more important than the amount we give. We need to give when the Holy Spirit touches our hearts. "The Lord does not need our offerings. . . . Yet God allows us to show we appreciate His kindness. . ." (Review & Herald, Dec. 6, 1887, adapted).

May we give our tithes and offerings to God with a happy spirit (2 Corinthians 9:7), trusting that "God is able to shower all kinds of blessings on you. So in all things and at all times you will have everything you need" (verse 8, NIV). Let's support God's work by sharing what we own with the people working full-time to spread the gospel so more people will learn to love our Lord and Savior!

Dieting Dos and Don'ts

You want to lose weight for good, but you are tired of the dieting merry-go-round. Maybe it is time for a lifestyle change.

What not to do

Don't go on temporary diets you read about in magazines and most popular books, because they don't work over the long time. Instead, change how you buy, prepare, eat, and think about food.

Don't drink sugary drinks [Cola, Pepsi, Gatorade, etc] and alcohol. Your body cannot easily sense liquid calories. Drink water instead. Water has no calories.

Don't eat processed snack foods. Many people have six to nine snacks throughout the day—and the calories add up!

Packaged snacks are dangerous. If you get hungry between meals, eat some fresh fruit. You have to eat eight apples in order to get the calories in one blueberry muffin!

[8 apples = 1 blueberry muffin]
So, a fresh apple or an orange is better than a packaged food.

Avoid fast food at all costs. It is not just calories that count; the quality of the food you eat influences the hormones that regulate your weight.

Don't spoil your sleep by staying up late to watch TV or play on your iPad. Not enough sleep is closely linked with

obesity.

Don't eat late at night. Several studies have shown that eating earlier in the day is one of the keys to healthy weight control. A large study of men and women also showed that people who eat late in the evening may be increasing their risk of heart attack and stroke by 55 percent!

What you should do

Plan your meals in advance – at least a few days ahead of time. Make them as plant based as possible and based on unrefined ingredients.

If you are busy through the week, prepare two or three meals on the weekend and freeze them for when you won't be able to cook during the week.

Drink water continuously between your main meals.

Always eat breakfast.

Set a reasonable goal so you don't set yourself up to fail. Studies have shown that significant health benefits are possible with even a 5 to 10 percent loss of your starting weight.

Make movement a natural and regular part of your life. If you go to the gym three times a week but spend the rest of the time sitting, you are still leading a sedentary (inactive) lifestyle.

Quinoa Black Bean Burger Patties




- 1 ½ cups quinoa cooked
- 2 sweet potatoes medium-sized, halved lengthwise
- 1 can black beans rinsed and drained
- 1/2 onion finely diced
- 2 cloves garlic finely minced
- 1/4 teaspoon sea salt
- 1 teaspoon chili powder
- 1/4 teaspoon dried oregano
- 2 teaspoon cumin powder
- olive oil, extra virgin

Chili Lime Sauce

- 1/4 cup vegemaise or mayonnaise
- 1 teaspoon chili sauce or just ketchup
- juice of 1/4 of a lime

- Preheat the oven to 400° F.
- Halve the sweet potatoes lengthwise and bake them with the cut side down for 30 minutes.
- Meantime cook the quinoa according to the instructions on the package.
- Now prepare the Chili Lime Sauce by adding all the ingredients to a small bowl and stir until smooth. Keep refrigerated until needed.
- In a large bowl, add black beans and cooked sweet potatoes.
- Mash until the consistency is only slightly chunky. Some beans will be completely mashed and others will not this will help create a nice texture.
- Add quinoa, onion, garlic and spices, mix until well combined.
- Divide the mixture into 8 even portions and form them with your hands into a patty shape.
- Place quinoa and black bean patties onto a parchment-paper-lined baking tray and brush the top with a thin layer of olive oil.
- Bake for 20 minutes, flip them and brush with olive oil. Bake for another 10 minutes or until they start to firm up.
